

The Group Seditary Scavenger Hunt Game:

Instructions:

1. Have each small group of 3 or 4 combine to form a group of 6 or 7. It is important that groups are no fewer than 6 and no greater than 7, so two groups of 4 should NOT combine (that would be 8, afterall....).

2. Introduction to the group: "Welcome to the BCF Indoor Scavenger hunt. Your group will be asked to cooperate with each other to come up with items or information that you will soon hear about. There will be several rounds, so your group has lots of chances to win. I will be announcing the category for each round, and Tom and Irene will serve as Roving Judges. This is not a speed contest, but you will probably have no more than 20 seconds or so per round, so you do have to work together QUICKLY. When your group has their items or information together, have one representative stand up in their place. I will call time and we will see which group wins the prize for each round. For the rounds that require items, your representative needs to show them to the audience and judges. Any questions?"

3. Further instructions for round one ONLY : "For the first round only, we need each representative to come up to the front of the room and present their items to the judges."

Round 1: Longest Piece of Hair (20 sec) -- "BEGIN!" (Shout it out and give just enough time to get people pulling their hair out and running forward... you can say thigns like "10 more seconds, etc. Keep it snappy). Judges will compare and throw candy at the group that wins

Note: each othe successive rounds, the groups remain in their area, and you should quickly go around the room after time has been called to see which group has the most stuff. For example, in the round "furthest away from Brown" -- you can just pick out one group and say where is your furthest person from? They may say "Seattle". Then say remain standing if you are further than Seattle. Ask another group -- get their place (Hawaii). "Keep standing if further than hawaii" ... " can anyone beat Japan, etc., etc....basically the idea is to determine very quickly by going "up" which team wins that round, have everyone APPLAUD, and throw candy, then quickly on to the next round. On a numerical round, you can begin by taking a guess, like saying. Everyone with more than 6 things remain standing. More than 8, More than 10, etc...as you eliminate groups until you have like 2 people left, then you can ask what each one had to see who is the winner....you get the picture.

Round 2: Furthest Away from Brown

Round 3: Lowest combined birthday number (Assign the month of the year a number and get a total)

Round 4: Odds and End Round: Total number of the following items present in the group:

A. Brush or Comb B. Pack of Dental Floss C. Toothbrush D. Tooth Pick6:

Round 5: Odds and Ends Round II: Total number of following:

A. Fingernail clippers B. Lipstick C. Packs of Gum D. Pencils

Round 6: Individual in the group with most number of keys on a keychain

Round 7: Individual in the group with most number of sibilings

Round 8: Individual in the group with most number of body piercings

Round 9: Total number of wallet-sized pictures in the group.

Note: on the individual things (rounds 6-9) maybe have the individual responsible for the things stand up or be pointed out. Cheer a lot and keep it flowing!!!!
