

Summer Crew Job Description

Time: Full-time

Location: Cedarville, MI

Start Date: As early as April 28

Description:

We are hiring summer crew in the following areas:

Kitchen: Hot and cold food preparation, baking, serving food, stocking food orders, general cleaning. Experience helpful but not necessary.

Facilities: Carpentry, painting, mowing, window washing, cutting firewood, building fires and other maintenance and repair tasks.

Creation Care: helping to educate, interpret and involve guests, staff and crew towards enjoying, appreciating and stewarding creation as seen in the natural setting that God has given us.

Recreation: Serve as lifeguards and waterfront instructors; maintain recreational equipment. Experience with boats (powerboats, sailboats, canoes, kayaks) is helpful but not necessary. Advanced Lifesaving or Lifeguarding, CPR and Standard First Aid certification necessary - in some cases these classes may be taken while on crew, if the applicant is a strong swimmer and/or has experience with boats.

Children's Program: Responsible to plan, lead and supervise age-graded program and activities for children and teens during Family Camps from mid-June to late August.

General Store: Serve store customers and assist with store operations like mail sorting, inventory control, displays and signs, bookkeeping and deposits, and cleaning.

Office: Serve camp guests in person or over the phone; assist with registrations, data entry, reservations, publications and mailings.

Guest Services and Housekeeping: Serve the guests by setting up meeting areas and providing clean, well-stocked facilities. Housekeeping and laundry work, supervising student work details.

Photographer: Document the summer by taking photographs and creating the summer staff newsletter. Work on a team to organize the weekly crew worship. Training in sound and visual media is a possibility.

Potential candidates should possess a strong work ethic, servant's heart, a desire to grow spiritually and a willingness to care for guests and staff through hard work.

Ability to exemplify the love of Christ through humble, excellent and genuine guest service.

Must possess excellent personal hygiene and manners.

Work a flexible schedule as our guest group needs change.

Ability to work independently, as well as part of a team and have a willingness to help lead volunteer groups.

Living at Cedar Campus is a rewarding experience. We are located in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan on Lake Huron, approximately 45 miles from Mackinac Island.

You will have the opportunity to serve our guests, live in community, make life-long friends, grow closer to God and experience His creation.
